Gary Alan Case, 65, of Edgerton, WI, passed away unexpectedly in his home on August 4, 2018.

Gary was born on July 4, 1953, in Beloit, Wisconsin, the youngest son of Richard and Ruth Case. He attended F.J. Turner High School, graduating in 1971. He was active in the Boy Scouts throughout his youth, ultimately earning the distinction of Eagle Scout. He spent most of his career in manufacturing, including many successful years with Fairbanks Morse, Regal Beloit, Cotta Transmission, and others, before calling it a career in the spring of 2018.

Gary enjoyed traveling and was especially fond of taking day trips around the back roads of Wisconsin. A recent train trip to Kansas City was a highlight of his brief retirement. He loved the outdoors, especially camping, hiking, and going for long walks in nature. He loved a good laugh, particularly when shared with his family. His dry sense of humor and wicked comedic timing will be missed.

Gary's Christian faith was important to him. He dedicated many years of his life to the ministry, primarily while attending Calvary Tabernacle Church in Beloit. While a member there he regularly preached, built up the church's Spanish language ministry, and for several years served as principal of the K-

12 school.

Gary is survived by his father, Richard (Francine) of Beloit; three sons, Timothy (Jasmine) of Eau Claire, WI, Philip (Courtney) of Kansas City, MO, and Christopher of Platoro, CO; and a granddaughter, Evelyn, of Eau Claire. He was preceded in death by his mother, Ruth, and his brother, Steven.

He was a devoted son, a proud and supportive father, and a loving and affectionate "Grandpa Gary."

A visitation will be held at the Rosman Funeral Home, 1125 Cranston Road, Beloit WI on Saturday, August 11, 2018 from 10:00 AM until 12:00 PM Noon.

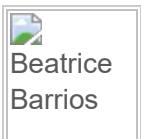
